Conflicts

- Conflict -> it shows action
- -> it shows reaction
- -> it shows characters' justification for existing in a story



Conflicts

- it needs to be simple and logic
- each character has an aim
- conflict keeps your viewer attentive



How to create a conflict

- a new information appears
- a new character appears
- one of the opposite forces acts, making the other force react



How it works:

Characters

- Primer (Main) Characters
 - is the the one through whom the audience experiences the story subjectively.
- Secondary (Supporting) Characters
 - is a character in a narrative that is not the focus of the primary storyline, but appears. Sometimes, supporting characters may develop a complex back-story of their own.



Characters

- Extras
 - A **background actor** or **extra** is a performer in a film, stage, who appears in a nonspeaking or nonsinging (silent) capacity, usually in the background (for example, in an audience or busy street scene).
 - If you use extras make sure you direct them.

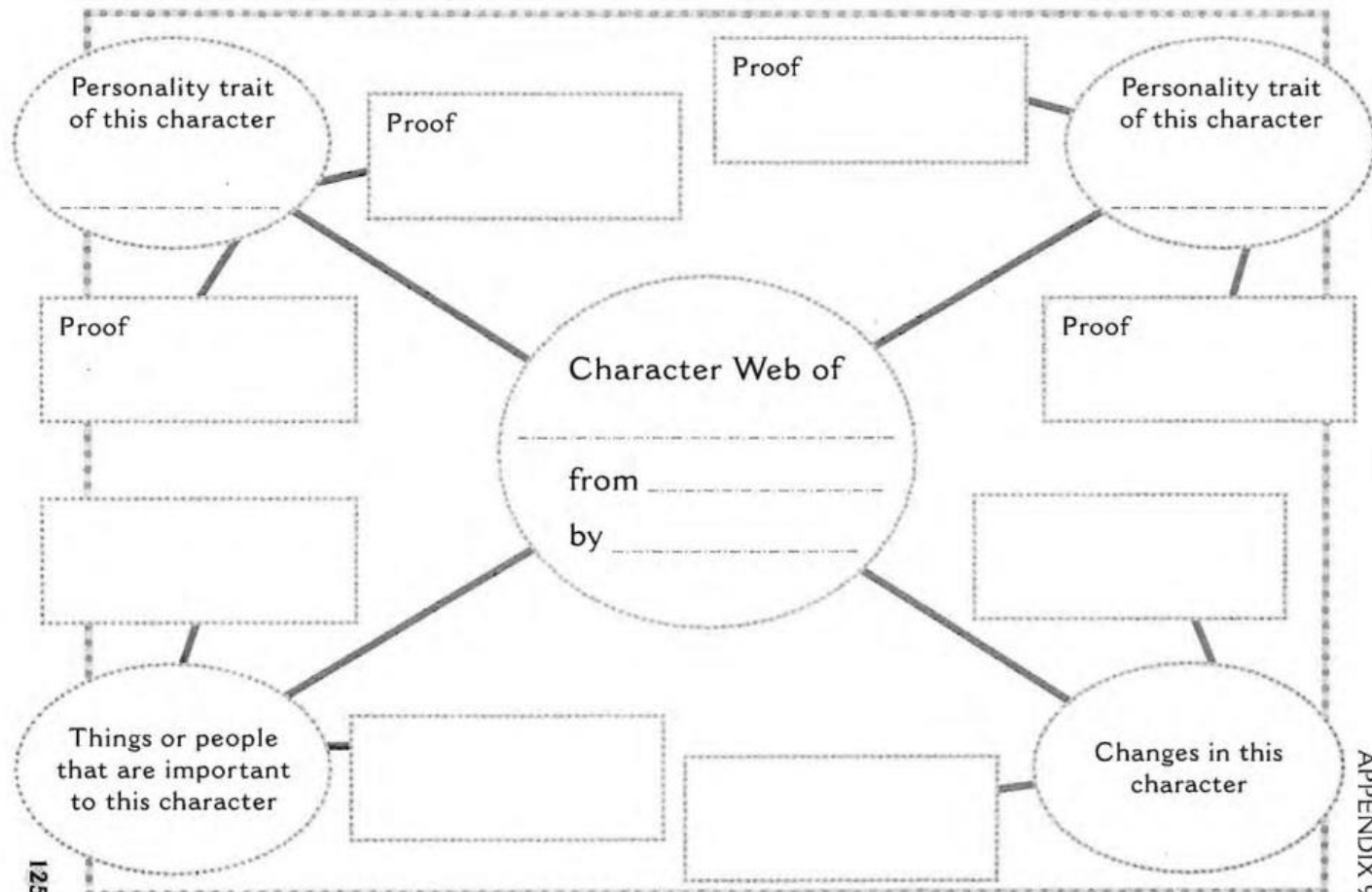


How to build a character

- Disrupts the normality
- Important information
- Cinderella vs Step-sisters



Basic Scheme of a Narrative

RISING ACTION: Cinderella

- All the action that leads to the climax.
- Finding the dress.
- Cinderella meeting the Prince.



Basic Scheme of a Narrative

CLIMAX: Cinderella

- Loosing her slipper.

ENDING: Cinderella

- Slipper is fitting
- Wedding.



Format of the Script

Scene Heading _____ INT. OFFICE - DAY

Action _____ RUFUS sits at a desk, fingers furiously tap dancing on a keyboard. He pauses for briefing and looks at the clock on the wall. The digital display reads "5:34"

A TIRE SCREECH

Rufus looks out the office window to see JOHN storming into the office complex.

Character Name _____

RUFUS (V.O.)
(sarcastically)
Here comes the sexiest man in the universe.

John bursts in through the front door.

Parenthetical _____ JOHN
(breathing heavily)
Hell's Bells Rufus, the traffic is insane. Is it ready?

Dialogue _____ RUFUS
Is what ready?

JOHN
(repeating himself)
Is it ready?

Vocabulary

- CLOSE ON = a shot description that strongly suggests a close-up on some object, action, or person.
- CUT TO = The most simple and common transition. (FADE CUT)
- EXTREME CLOSE UP = Means the camera is placed very close to the subject or action



Vocabulary

- ESTABLISHING SHOT = A shot, usually from a distance.
- EXT = EXTERIOR.
- FLASH CUT (FLASH) = A transition where the screen flashes to white before entering the next scene.
- INT = Interior.
- O.S. or O.C. = Off-screen or Off-camera.
- POV = Point of View
- V.O. = Voice Over

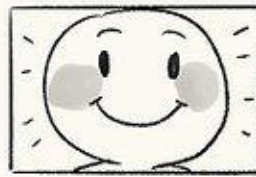

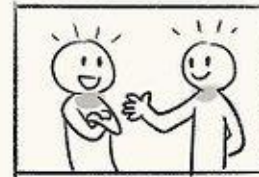
